Dear friends, peace and joy be with you!

Happy Reformation Day! I write to you on October 31, and I am excited for the ways in which God is at work in us and with us and praying for how God will continue to work through us!!

Last month we talked about the work we have to do, and it's a really important work. But it's not complex like you might think. The invitation was to simply *be who you are*. Be who you are. Be who God made you to be. And continue to grow into and discover and uncover more about who God made you to be. Where are you strong? Where are you weak? What do you like? What do you not like? What are your passions? What are your growth areas? What are your grace areas?

I love the call of Ephesians 5:10. It's a simple invitation: find out what pleases the Lord. It doesn't dictate or mandate anything. It's an open invitation to discover, uncover, and encounter. And as you discover, uncover, and encounter (God), the path will become clearer. What's great about this call is that you don't have to have it all together to begin. It's just an invitation to come and try-out and try things on, to see what fits and find out what works; or doesn't work.

That's significant in a society where we're not only expected to have it together but rewarded for having it together, having the answers, or knowing the right way or the best way – especially when things are unclear or uncertain. The Good News is that to follow, love, or serve God, you don't have to have the answers, you don't need to know the way, because Jesus *is* The Way, and God will help you *on the way*. What that means is all you need to do is show up: God will do the rest.

In the same way that Paul encourages the Galatians to "not grow weary in doing good", I encourage you: don't grow weary in seeking or serving the Lord. Karl Jaspers, a great philosopher, once said that philosophy is not about possession of truth but the search for it. He says that philosophy means to be "on the way." Let us be *on the way*. And as we seek to be *on the way*, let us continue to follow Christ who is The Way *and* The Truth *and* The Life.

Keep an eye out for a congregational email I have been writing over the past week, it will help us engage the phenomenon of election stress and post-election stress. I'll offer some ideas for how to handle election stress and what to do with post-election stress.

For now, be kind to yourself. Be kind to others. The plate of suffering, as Simone Weil talks about, is being rapidly passed in new and ridiculous ways. Take no part in it. Protect your peace. Turn the tv off, take breaks from social media, get out in nature, and talk with God. Feel the feels. Be angry. Be frustrated. Be hopeless. Feel helpless. But don't forget to turn to God so that you can be strengthened. And know that you're not alone. My phone is also open. Send me a text or give me a call if you're mad, upset, frustrated, or weary. You're not alone and you don't have to go it alone. I'm here and God is with us *on the way*.
