FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

What's up Church!

Happy Advent - a time of waiting, preparation, and stillness.

The French sculptor, Auguste Rodin, once said, "Patience is also a form of action." Waiting, rest, and stillness can be difficult for us (in a success-driven, achievement-focused society) because it can *feel* like we're not doing anything. But doing nothing, paradoxically, is actually doing something, and it's a very important something. In a world of busyness, I think we forget that we are human *beings*, not human *doings*. It's constantly go-go-go, do-do-do, achieve-achieve-achieve. And often times it's at any cost. Your mental health, physical health, social and emotional health. Busyness, success, and achievement comes at a cost. So, Advent is an important time to stop, think, reflect, and determine if we're busy with and successful at not only the right things but the things of God.

As we look to the New Year, I want to announce our very first *Theme of the Year*. A *Theme of the Year* is a theme that will guide, orient, and influence our spiritual lives so that much of what we do will center on this theme. The theme for this upcoming year is *Rooted*. We're going to look at not only what the word means, but what it means and looks like for our lives of faith so that we can be(come) rooted in not just the right things, but the good things and the God-things. Keep an eye out for more!

Currently, we're kicking off a 4-week Advent Discussion Group centered around a book by Alistair Begg. This group is process-oriented, which means it is not focused on learning: it's focused on becoming! The questions, discussion, and dialogue will help us become *Rooted* in the ethos of Advent and our lives of faith. I will provide breakfast each of the four weeks and the menu includes: Breakfast Casserole, Veggie Omelets, Baked French Toast, and a Breakfast Burritos.

Beyond Advent, I plan to host **Bible Studies** that will be *Rooted* in books of the Bible and help us establish *Roots* in topical studies like anger, grief, trauma, evangelism and church growth, faith and mental illness, spiritual growth, and stress and coping.

We will also launch a **Dinner for 8 Group**. Dinner for 8 is exactly what it sounds like. 8 people sign up to have dinner together. Each month, 8 more people will sign up (same and/or new members) and the group will be hosted at someone's house each month. Pastor JP and Bri will host the first kick-off dinner in the New Year, so keep an eye out for the sign-up sheet.

We will also launch **The Lunch Bunch**. Once a month, we'll set a time, a date, and a place to gather together and grow together over a nice meal at a local restaurant. This will also begin in the New Year!

We have a lot of exciting things in the mix. We hope you'll find time to connect with more people here at church outside of church, and be inspired to invite others to come, experience, and be a part of what God is doing here in us, with us, and among us.
